Miller-Keystone Blood Center (MKBC) is the exclusive blood supplier to 32 hospitals in Eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey. In fact, MKBC delivers more than 100,000 blood products to its customers annually and has been doing so for more than 50 years. We all hope we never need life-saving blood products for ourselves or our family members, but it is comforting to know that a safe and well-managed blood products supply is at the ready for our community when needed.

The blood donation process, from generous donor to thankful recipient, includes a lot of moving parts and operating expenses. The process starts with recruiting blood donors, followed by collecting the blood, testing and component manufacturing, and finally storage and delivery to hospitals. In fact, each component of the process is closely regulated for safety and requires not only blood of the donors, but also highly trained and skilled employees, careful planning, the most up-to-date testing, and financial resources to ensure a safe and ready blood supply. DONOR ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES FOR TRAVEL UPDATED!

Miller-Keystone Blood Center is grateful for each and every blood donor who is willing to roll up their sleeves and give the gift of life. Deferring a willing blood donor is very difficult for us, particularly at times when we are experiencing a critical blood shortage.



Many of the eligibility guidelines for travel were recently revised. If you were previously deferred for a cumulative stay of three (3) months or more in the United Kingdom countries of England, Northern Ireland, Scotland,

Wales, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, Gibraltar, or the Falkland Islands between 1980 and 1996 – OR – for a cumulative stay of five (5) years or more in France or Ireland from 1980 through 2001... you are now most likely eligible to donate blood!

LEAVING A LASTING LEGACY

When he passed in late winter of 2019, George Ashman was 93. And, what he left behind is a lesson for everyone about the power of community, volunteerism and action.

Several newspaper articles tell of George's inspiring community and military service. George grew up with a family that understood and embraced the importance of giving back. George also understood that giving of oneself to one's country and his fellow man also has lasting impact having served as a member of the Monument Men as part of his service in the US Army's 90th Infantry Division in World War II.

When George was alive, he was a man of action. In death, he still is having a large impact on the community where he lived his entire life. He was born in Palmerton, graduated from Palmerton High School, lived in Palmerton most of his life and was even a founding member of the Palmerton Area Historical Society.

He was also a devoted volunteer and blood donor for Miller-Keystone Blood Center. Following in his parents' footsteps, Ashman began giving blood the minute he was old enough to do so and continued for decades in the spirit of community service.

In fact, not only did he give blood himself, he became a one man blood donor recruitment machine. George coordinated Palmerton area blood drives well into his eighties and when he couldn't give blood anymore, he still heavily recruited others.

"George ran his blood drive like a well-oiled machine," said Monika Weigers, MKBC's Manager of Mobile Recruitment. "He was a retired engineer."

"We always used George as an example on how blood drives should be run. Whenever a coordinator needed a new idea on how to recruit new blood donors for how to run a blood drive, we would always share George's methods," she added. George was recognized in 2004 as an MKBC Community Leader, honoring his "outstanding contributions as an individual blood drive coordinator and establishing blood donation as a community service priority."

George also understood the importance of monitoring blood donors after their gift of blood. He knew the Canteen was an important piece of the blood donation process and that hydration and calories were vital, not only to a blood donor's immediate recovery, but to their

> interest in coming back again and again. George realized that a person who had an exceptional experience, one that included feeling great following blood donation, was more likely to come back. And even though MKBC provided high-quality snacks to blood donors, George Ashman provided supplemental snacks to individuals participating in Palmerton area blood drives. He even left a financial gift in his will to MKBC for the specific purpose of "establishing a canteen fund" for bloodmobiles and drives in the Palmerton, Bowmanstown and Lower Towamensing Township area. His legacy of those snacks will live on for decades.

Other organizations that have benefitted from George Ashman's desire to leave a lasting legacy include First United Church of Christ, Palmerton Area Historical Society, Meals on Wheels of Palmerton, Palmerton Area Library Association, Palmerton Memorial Park and several others.

"George Ashman is the kind of human being that we should all aspire to be," said Peter Castagna, President of Miller-Keystone Blood Center. "We are grateful for the legacy he has left to his community through our organization and hope he has encouraged others to get involved, give blood and make a lasting impact on the community."
