There are many ways that someone can make a difference- and that includes donating blood and saving a life!


Did You Know...

What does it mean to be a Universal Blood Donor?

Individuals with type **O-negative blood** are referred to as **Universal Blood Donors**. This is



because the red blood cells of an O-negative donor can be transfused to anyone, regardless of their blood type. This is especially critical in accident cases, where there isn't time to confirm a patient's blood type.

As a way to increase an organization's commitment to the Blood Center and our community, MKBC recently launched our "Drops" recruitment campaign. Companies signing up to participate receive monthly emails containing content to share with your employees. If you happen to have a gift certificate lying around, or someone is willing to donate a gift card... try to offer your donor pool an incentive for

We can include a note on your flyer stating "The names of presenting donors will be entered into a

raffle to win __!" Another incentive that attracts attention is food! We can include a note that says "All presenting donors will receive a fresh-made chocolate chip cookie," etc. If this interests you but you need some ideas, ask your account manager! They will be happy to brainstorm with you!

Support MKBC with a Qualified Charitable Distribution

Did you know that if you are 70-½ or older, you can consider giving to your favorite charitable organization through a qualified charitable distribution (QCD)? A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from a 401(k) or IRA account, payable to a qualified 501(c)(3) charity, like Miller-Keystone Blood Center.

In fact, there are IRS rules that will require you to take required minimum distributions (RMD) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts like 401(k)s and IRAs in the year that you reach 72 or 73 for some who reached age 72 after December 31, 2022. When taken as income, those dollars will be taxed at your marginal rate. One way to eliminate or reduce the tax impact of RMD income is by donating to your favorite charity. Much of this is complicated so we encourage you to speak with your financial planner, tax preparer, legal counsel or other advisor. But we hope you think of Miller-Keystone Blood Center when making decisions about where to distribute funds if you are planning (or required) to take action this year or next. We hope MKBC makes the list of your favorite charities!

Some details to consider:

What are the potential benefits to making a gift like this?

- You may avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your tax-deferred accounts to support your favorite cause.
- You may satisfy some or all of your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year.
- You may reduce your taxable income, even if you do not itemize deductions.
