They sent their son, Mike, off to college and once he was grown up and living on his own, he moved to his hometown of Catasauqua and lived near his parents. And in their 18-year-long retirement before Bill's passing, they enjoyed trips to Ireland, Hawaii,

Iceland, Norway, Finland and always continued their time at the shore.

Bill was a long-time blood donor and MKBC volunteer, mom was a platelet donor whenever she was able to

"Dad was in the 12-gallon club; when he couldn't give blood anymore and after he was retired, he became a very active volunteer with Miller-Keystone," said Mike of his late father.

"Dad liked going to the blood drives," added Mike. "In fact, he especially enjoyed meeting students at the high school drives because he followed high school sports and could be found attending the games of students he'd recently met at a drive."

Both parents were devoted volunteers. In fact, they spent 25,000 hours of their personal time in service to MKBC.

In 2015, MKBC renamed its Student Volunteer Scholarship award to the Bill & Jacqueline Younger Volunteer Scholarship. This award is presented to a high school senior who has

> gone above and beyond as a service volunteer with Miller-Keystone Blood Center.

Today, the Younger family supports MKBC by helping fund the annual scholarship award.


"They were generous people. They were great parents. I learned so much from my dad – mostly about just being honest with people. I never heard my dad say no - they gave to their church, and to Good

### 2024 BOOTS AND BADGES BLOOD DRIVE COMPETITION ANNOUNCED

Allentown's Fire & Police Departments Collected Bloo 🔁 onations to Benefit Patients in our Community Hospitals



In February, the Boots and Badges Blood Drive Competition between the Allentown Fire Department and the Allentown Police Department kicked off with a blood drive event at MKBC's Hamilton Donor Center.

"Every day, regional first responders put their lives on the line to help residents in our community," says Dara Gonzalez, Community Liaison, MKBC. "The Allentown Fire Department and Allentown Police Department understand the importance of blood donation, and the goal of the friendly Boots and Badges competition is not only to save lives, but to demonstrate and inspire others to give the gift of life as well."

In addition to the February Blood Drive, there will be additional Allentown Boots and Badges Blood Drive events throughout the calendar year. In order to donate, individuals must be 16 years of age\* or older, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds and be feeling healthy; they must not have donated in the past eight weeks. After the initial two-week event ended in a tie, the February competition was extended another two weeks. "Thank the Donor®" is a program that allows transfusion recipients to anonymously connect with their blood donors via email, enabling the recipient to thank the donor(s) for their lifesaving generosity.

"From the whole of our being, thank you so much for the gift you have given to both myself and my spouse as we struggle with health concerns. You are truly giving us the gift of life and hope for improvement. Thank you so very much."

"Without you, I would not have survived to see my children graduate high school. God bless and thank you so much."

"Thank you so much for donating your blood, which is now being transfused to me. I have an aggressive form of leukemia, and this blood (and chemotherapy) will hopefully keep me alive long enough for a bone marrow transplant. God bless you."

### BLOOD CENTER ANNOUNCES CHANGES TO REWARDS PROGRAM

New Gift Card Vendor. As a way of improving its donor rewards program, Miller-Keystone Blood Center recently announced that



it was changing its gift card vendor. As of March 1, 2024, gift cards will be sent via email, but donors will have an option to have a physical gift card mailed to them. The new e-gift card also provides a wider range of redemption options for donors, with 135+ to choose from!
