### January is National Blood Donor Month!



Did you know that every two seconds in the United States, someone urgently needs blood? This critical demand extends beyond unexpected emergencies like car accidents, encompassing a broad spectrum of medical treatments. Patients undergoing cancer therapies, cardiovascular or orthopedic surgeries, organ and bone marrow transplants, and even

premature infants often rely on blood transfusions. Additionally, individuals with inherited blood disorders, such as sickle cell anemia, are particularly dependent on a safe and stable community blood supply.

Despite 65% of Americans being eligible to donate blood, only 3% currently do so. Moreover, just 12% of blood donations come from individuals in communities of color, underscoring the urgent need to diversify our donor base. Between 2019 and 2021, blood donations from individuals aged 65 and older increased by 40%, further emphasizing the importance of engaging younger and more diverse donors to ensure

that blood is available to anyone in need.

Since 1970, January has been recognized as **National Blood Donor Month**—a time to honor the extraordinary generosity of volunteer blood donors and raise awareness about the critical need for blood donations. At MKBC, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to those who selflessly give the gift of life and encourage everyone eligible to join this vital effort. Your generosity not only saves lives today but also provides hope for a healthier, brighter future for countless individuals in need.

### **Blood Center Launches Universal Hero Club**

In December 2024, MKBC launched the Universal Hero Club to recognize and reward our O-negative/O-positive red blood cell donors and AB-positive/AB-negative plasma donors for their



commitment to our community blood supply. The red blood cells from an O-negative donor, or or the plasma from an AB (positive/negative) donor, can be transfused to anyone in need, regardless of blood type. Additionally, the red blood cells from an O-positive donor can be transfused to any patient with an Rh-positive blood type. These blood and plasma donations are especially important in accident/trauma cases, where there may not be time to identify a patient's specific blood type.

How many community blood centers are there in the United States, and how much blood do they collect?

According to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Blood Establishment Registration database, there are 53 community blood centers and 90 hospital-based blood centers in the United States.

Independent, community blood centers - including Miller-Keystone Blood Center - collect approximately 60% of the nation's blood supply.


