During the past fiscal year, HCSC's In-Patient and Out-Patient Linen Services divisions built on their long-standing reputation for quality and reliability while investing in innovation to meet evolving customer needs. From modernizing textile processing facilities to strengthening customer partnerships, we continued to streamline supply chain solutions, allowing hospitals and healthcare providers to stay focused on their primary mission: patient care.

THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- **Reconnecting through collaboration.** Hosted the first in-person "Linen Coordinators Meeting" since the pandemic, drawing 50 guests from 15 hospital systems in Fall 2024. Key topics included operations updates, product advancements, and service initiatives, along with insights on RFID and our Full-Service Scrub Suit Management Program. A second in-person meeting in Spring 2025 featured the introduction of our new President & CEO, Rami Nemeh, who shared his vision for deeper collaboration between HCSC Linen Services and our hospital partners. Guests also engaged in sessions on infection control, accreditation, business trends, and customer service tools, including new portals and scorecards.
- **Investing in automation.** Budgeted and began to plan for the installation of an automatic garment sorting system at our Ambulatory Care hub to enhance efficiency and expand RFID capabilities.
- **Upgrading technology platforms.** Partnered with ABS to replace our legacy laundry operations system with a more advanced platform, positioning us for future growth.
- **Maintaining quality assurance.** Sustained accreditation across all five textile processing facilities through HLAC (Healthcare Laundry Accreditation Council) and/or TRSA's (Textile Rental Services Association) Hygienically Clean program.
- **Enhancing customer insights.** Expanded quarterly business reviews and customer scorecards, while continuing linen utilization studies, loss audits, and cost management in-services to help hospital partners optimize performance and reduce costs.
- **Delivering customer satisfaction.** Achieved strong survey ratings, with scores of 9.4 (out of 10) in Fall 2024 and 9.3 in Spring 2025.
- **Building future leadership.** Advanced leadership development through training opportunities for mid-level managers, ensuring a strong succession pipeline for years to come.

HCSC proudly introduced three new full-service scrub management programs and launched a full-service privacy curtain program. These initiatives reflect our commitment to building on a legacy of quality while embracing innovative solutions that enhance efficiency, safety, and convenience for the healthcare organizations we serve.

Though still in its early stages, HCSC Solutions is building on our legacy of trusted service by applying data-driven innovation to empower organizations. By helping partners collect, shape, deliver, and interpret their data, we enable smarter strategic decision-making and streamlined problem solving. Our real-time dashboards and tools are designed to transform processes, improve efficiency, reduce errors, and lower operating costs - driving value far into the future.

THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- **Expanding visibility.** Showcased Solutions applications at the Blood Centers of America (BCA) Supply Chain Networking Conference and the Advanced Manufacturing Technology Show, increasing market awareness and industry engagement.
- **Engaging potential partners.** Hosted "From Data to Decisions: Manufacturing and Power BI," a lunch-and-learn session for approximately 15 guests to demonstrate how Solutions tools can address real-world challenges.
- **Strengthening sales capabilities.** Designed new customer models and templates for use in demonstrations and business development.
- **Supporting nonprofit growth.** Developed an affordable customer relationship management (CRM) tool tailored to nonprofits seeking a simple, effective solution for data storage and management.
- **Reaching a major milestone.** Achieved the first sale of a philanthropy dashboard, demonstrating both proof of concept and market demand.



Miller-Keystone Blood Center



Miller-Keystone Blood Center serves more than 3 million residents across 21 counties. As the primary blood supplier to regional hospitals and a trusted partner for healthcare organizations during emergencies, our mission remains clear: to ensure that lifesaving blood products are available whenever and wherever they are needed. This is no small task, particularly amid the ongoing national blood shortage, as we often deliver more blood to certain regions than we collect from them.

Building on our legacy of reliability and service, we are also driven by a vision of innovation and expanded community engagement.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAST YEAR INCLUDE:

- **Advancing emergency care.** For the past year, ambulances within St. Luke's University Health Network (SLUHN), Geisinger, and Tower Health have carried MKBC-supplied low-titer O whole blood (LTOWB). As the new fiscal year began, plans included expanding to independent ambulance services - starting with Allentown EMS as our first independent partner.
- **Reengaging previously deferred donors.** Introduced a reentry program for donors who were previously deferred due to false positive test results for Hepatitis C or HIV. After a six-month deferral period, eligible individuals may schedule an appointment for collection of a reentry test sample. If the testing results are acceptable, the donor will be considered for reinstatement and eligible to donate blood, strengthening our community donor base and supporting patients in need.
- **Investing for impact.** Through the MKBC Tech Heroes program and the generosity of additional funders, we acquired new fleet vehicles and upgraded technologies to better support operations and outreach.
- **Expanding community engagement.** Launched the monthly "Your Blood. Their Hope." podcast to raise awareness and inspire new blood donors.
- **Growing donor commitment.** Expanded participation in our Platelet Warrior and Universal Hero Clubs. More than 1,000 donors pledged to donate platelets 12 times within 12 months, while over 1,400 donors joined the Universal Hero Club - where type "O" donors commit to frequent whole blood or double red cell donations, and type "AB" donors pledge regular plasma donations. These dedicated donors receive recognition and special Blood Center gift upon completing their commitments.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all of our hospital partners including **St. Lukes University Health Network, Geisinger, and Tower Health**. In addition to active participation on multiple MKBC/HCSC boards and committees, these partners host regularly scheduled blood drives with many locations earning MKBC Local Leader status (collecting 200 units or more) each year. In fact, a SLUHN employee recently joined us for a “Celebrate Hope” event where she was able to meet a transfusion recipient whose life was directly impacted by her blood donation, an inspiring reminder of the legacy of generosity that fuels our work.



From January through March, MKBC launched the inaugural **Blood Donor Madness**, a fun and friendly competition among colleges and universities in the region designed to increase community blood donations. Penn State Lehigh Valley emerged as the winner, earning \$10,000 for its scholarship fund. This program reflects our vision of finding creative ways to engage new donors and strengthen the next generation of community leaders.



The Blood Center takes pride in recognizing the service and sacrifice of our nation’s veterans by presenting blood donors with an **MKBC Challenge Coin**, a token of thanks for their military service. During fiscal year 2025, we were honored to present coins to 210 of our lifesaving blood donors, building on a legacy of gratitude and respect, and increasing the total number of challenge coins distributed to more than 1,000.



At the 2025 **America's Blood Centers (ABC) Annual Meeting**, MKBC proudly celebrated two significant honors. East Penn Manufacturing was named ABC Corporation of the Year, following our nomination recognizing their steadfast commitment to MKBC and the communities we serve. In addition, MKBC's Medical Director, D. Kip Kuttner, D.O., received a Distinguished Service Award for his leadership as chair of ABC's Scientific, Medical and Technical (SMT) Committee and his many contributions to the blood banking community and evidence-based medicine.

This year, we celebrated the extraordinary dedication of our **long-time donors**. Six donors reached the 50-gallon milestone, four achieved the 75-gallon level, and four remarkable individuals joined the ranks of our 100-gallon heroes. Their vision and commitment to saving lives embody the very best of our mission.

Our **Spring and Fall Appreciation Series** events honored the many individuals and partners, blood donors, drive sponsors, financial supporters, and volunteers whose generosity sustains our community every day. The spirit of connection was on full display at our most recent **Celebrate Hope** event. After enduring a 90-day hospitalization and receiving more than 50 transfusions, Lehigh Valley resident Sofia Groves met eight of the blood donors whose generosity saved her life. There was not a dry eye in the room as her story brought our mission vividly to life.



This Spring, we marked the arrival of **Bloodhound I**, the newest addition to MKBC's bloodmobile fleet. A ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrated this important milestone, made possible through the generosity of the Fleming Foundation and EnerSys, among others. This investment not only expands our reach but also reflects a shared vision for safeguarding the health and welfare of our entire community. Additional Bloodhounds are expected to arrive within the next two years, thanks in part to the generosity of Lehigh County (PA) and Northampton County (PA), each of which presented MKBC with \$250,000 grants.
